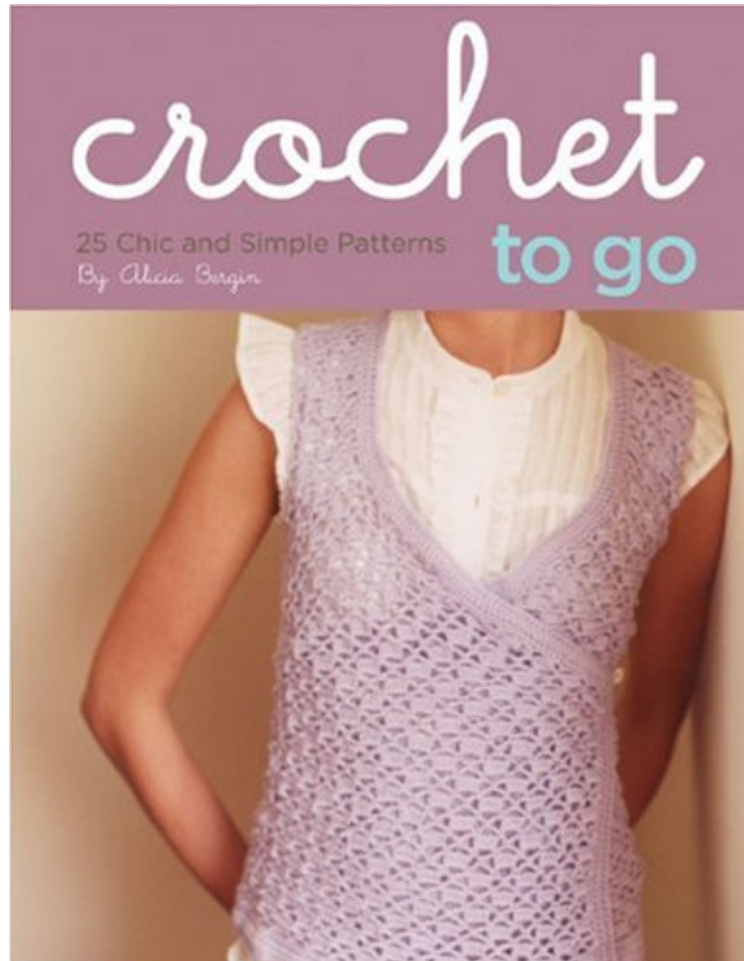

The cards can take being thrown in your yarn bag or carried around. GREAT idea! The problem is the actual directions. They are hard to follow! If the author had done the same deck with the international symbols on it, WOW - now that would be cool and they could be done on a single card format, not a folded format. I did the sweater on the cover and I added a ruffle to the sleeves. The gauge was way different and pulled kinda funny when overlapped. I had to add five buttons instead of two to get it to lay right. I also had to figure out how to make it from the picture because the directions were so convoluted. My daughter absolutely loved the final piece though and that sweater vest is the coolest thing in the pack. I plan on doing another one for my sister in a lighter weight yarn. I used Caron Simply Soft in Aqua for my daughter. I

also tried to do the Lover's Knot Shawl...NOT! The card into made it sound so simple but I could not understand the directions. I am an intermediate crocheter and it left me a little baffled. There was room on the card for a picture...don't know why the author didn't include a diagram. Many of the designs were less than inspired...enough with the hats, scarves, and placemats already! There were a few interesting pieces in the 25 cards but you'll have to figure them out from the pictures. The directions are written small and some of them overly complex. Try SweaterBabe's stuff...she gives the international symbols even if her designs are a bit riske (a few you had to be small and bra-less)...but the patterns in the designs can be adapted to other uses.
