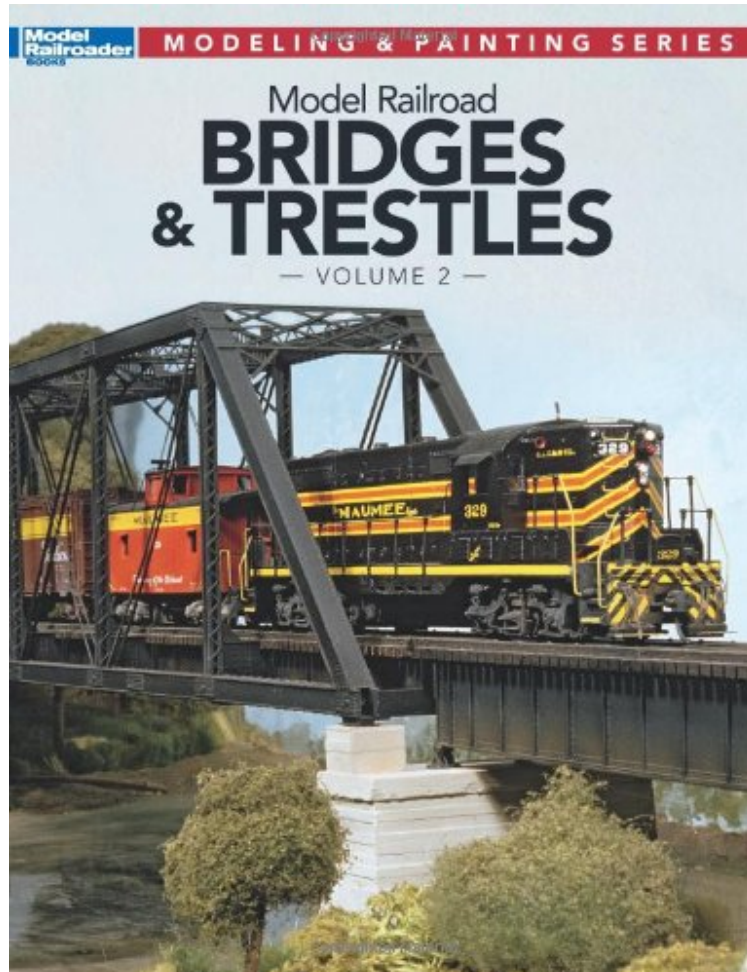

trestles. It is a summary of articles that have appeared in Model Railroader from 1993 through to the date of publication in 2012. If you are looking for more information on bridges and trestles, I suggest volume I which goes into more detail on the subject. Volume 1 is a similar format to Volume II being a collection of articles from 1962 through to 1991. However there seems to be more depth on the subject explaining the components and applications more than Volume II describes.
