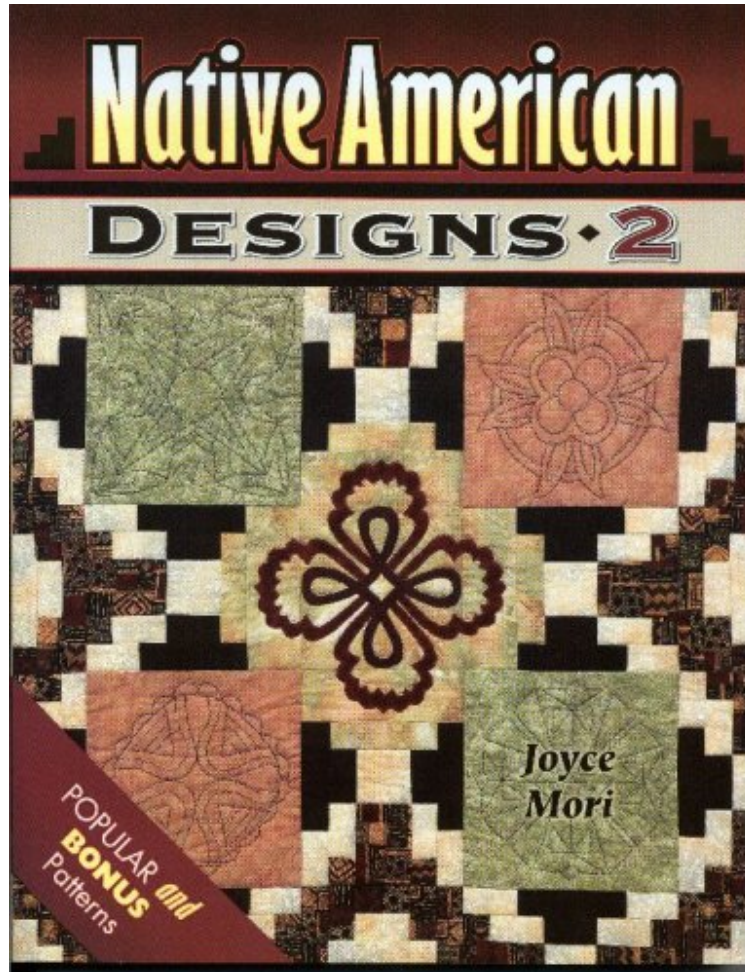

The patterns are taken from or based on indian artistry mainly in pottery, silverwork and basketry. The 100 plus patterns may be copied for personal use only. Using my own imagination, I can picture some of these interesting patterns being used for stenciling on a wall, inspiration for artwork as well as the quilt stitching that it was

designed for. I am sure that I will put some of these patterns to use.

The patterns represent a wide range of Native American cultures and can be used on all types of quilts, including traditional, contemporary, and ethnic.
