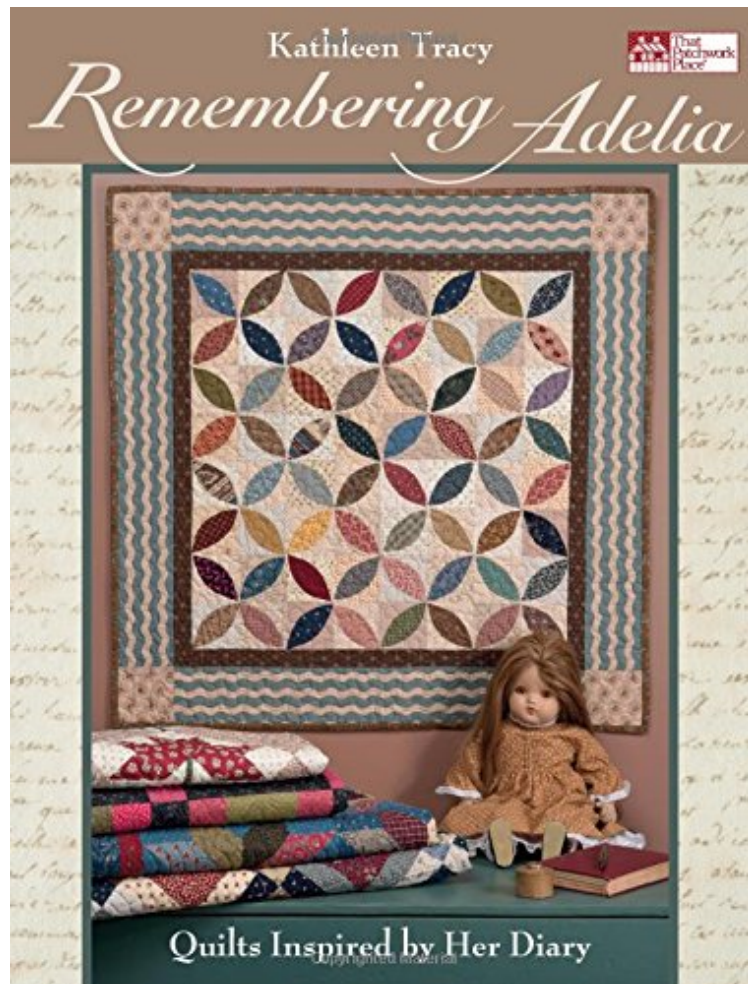

Author Kathleen Tracy has done it again by giving us 14 lovely historical projects with excellent instructions with the added bonus of the opportunity to step back in time as you read Adelia's diary and quilt history of her time. I can envision myself after a hard day's work sitting in my parlor stitching a quilt or a needle case. None of the projects are bed quilts but are intended for wall hangings or doll quilts. You will learn techniques such as ruching which was popular during Adelia's era. My favorite project is the Prairie Points Doll Quilt which is perfectly scrappy, just like in Adelia's day. Her journal illustrates how central sewing and quilting were in a woman's life during the nineteenth century. Includes period photos and 14 projects featuring nineteenth-century reproduction fabrics.

These quilts are inspired by the diary of Adelia, a young woman who lived in Illinois at the time of the American Civil War. The book includes excerpts from the diary and period photos.
